

**Alan Makovsky, Senior Fellow, Center for American Progress**

Alan Makovsky is a Senior Fellow at the Center for American Progress. Before joining CAP, Makovsky served as a Senior Professional Staff Member and Staff Director at the United States Congress, House Foreign Affairs Committee for 12 years. Previously, Makovsky worked at the U.S. Department of State for over a decade in various capacities, most notably as a political analyst and branch chief focused on Turkish and Aegean affairs in the Department's Bureau of Intelligence and Research. He also served as Special Advisor to Special Middle East Coordinator Dennis Ross in 1993 and as State Department liaison officer and political advisor to Operation Provide Comfort, based at Incirlik air force base and in Iraqi Kurdistan, in 1992. Makovsky worked for seven years (1994-2001) at The Washington Institute for Near East Policy, where he wrote frequently on Turkish issues and founded the Institute's Turkey Research Program, widely regarded as the most active and innovative Turkey program in Washington D.C. at that time.
