



In November 2016, the French Institute for International and Strategic Affairs (IRIS) launched the **Observatory of Climate Change Impacts on Defence and Security**, a four-year project financed by the Directorate General for International Relations and Strategy (French Ministry of Armed Forces).

## TEAM

IRIS gathers a **multidisciplinary team** with several scholars working on different topics (security, defence, migrations, energy, economy, climate change, regional areas), climate scientists, military officers, engineers, etc. The Observatory is **headed by Julia TASSE** (IRIS) and **François GEMENNE** (*Université de Liège*) and brings together researchers from other think tanks like the *Fondation pour la recherche stratégique* (FRS) and the *Group for Research and Information on Peace and Security* (GRIP).

**Trimestrial newsletter** to follow all news related to the Observatory's work :


